### ACTION ALERT - Retail Delivery Fee

In late-June more than 500 businesses and individuals participated in a rule making hearing hosted by the Colorado Department of Revenue (DOR). The proposed rule would require the DOR to collect a [Retail Delivery Fee](#) (RDF) on any taxable items delivered by a motor vehicle to a location in Colorado (including deliveries by third parties), effective July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. The fee, combined with the costs of compliance and implementation as well as other complexities, puts a significant burden on Rocky Mountain MCA members and other businesses operating in our state. Many of our members have raised concerns about how this will directly impact their business.

Two recent news stories ([Center Square article](#) & [Colorado Politics op-ed](#)) about this proposed rule have generated significant interest from many of you regarding how you can make your voice heard on the issue.

The [Simplify Colorado Sales Tax](#) coalition was formed to address these types of challenges, and in this case we urge concerned businesses and taxpayers to take action by:

- [Finding Your Legislator](#) and contacting [your legislators](#) and the [DOR Taxation Division](#) to voice concerns about how the RDF will negatively impact your business
- Contacting [Governor Polis' office](#) to ask for an executive order delaying the RDF and [Share Your Comments](#) with his office
